GRADING SYSTEM

East Juniata High School students' cumulative numerical average and class rank are weighted and calculated on all subjects from the beginning of ninth grade. Letter grade values are as follows:

Grade Earned	Numerical Average
A	90-100
B	80-89
C	70-79
D	60-69
F	59 and below

Grade Point Averages are based upon the 100% numerical point system and are calculated by tenths of a percentage (e.g. 90% = 3.5, 90.2% = 3.51, 90.4% = 3.52, etc.).

AP Language and Composition, AP Literature and Composition, AP Calculus, AP Computer Science Principles, AP Computer Science A, and AP U.S. History classes are weighted by a factor of 1.25. Advanced Chemistry and Biology, along with College Preparatory English (11 and 12) are weighted by a factor of 1.1
